EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In 2015, News Network projects were supported by The United Nations Democracy Fund (UNDEF), Janata Bank Limited and the Embassy of the Federal Republic of Germany. Page 1 of 6

UNDEF-assisted 2-year-long project, 'Rural Media Development Programme for Promoting Democracy and Human Rights', was launch in December 2014, though its implementation started from early 2015. It's the first of its kind project in Bangladesh aiming to improving the professional ability of journalists and CSOs to make people aware about rights based issues through media reporting and sharing information with the public. The project will cover 12 remote districts of the country.

German Embassy in Dhaka came up with a year-long funding support to raise knowledge and understanding on climate change issues of the journalists and build their capacity for better reporting.

Both the programmes gave importance to interaction with the media gatekeepers to promote the issues and publish quality items with care, aiming to raise public awareness and opinion.

In 2014, News Network received a Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) fund from the state owned Janata Bank limited to implement its 'Women Journalists Development Programme'. The project was completed in 2015. Anontex Trust Foundation, a Bangladeshi non-profit organisation also provided financial assistance to this project.

This year News Network again provided local support to Thomson Reuter Foundation to implement two different journalists training programmes in Dhaka on 'Editorial Judgment' and 'Sustainable Development in a Changing Climate'.

In 2015, News Network received total grant of BDT 6,894,199.05 (USD 88387) from the funding agencies and the expenditure stood at BDT 10,097,494.02 (USD 1,29,455).

5. PROGRESS

5.1 FELLOWSHIP ON JOURNALISM FOR YOUNG WOMEN

For the last 17 years News Network has been providing six to nine months fellowship on practical journalism to young women. Its objective is to encourage them to choose journalism as their profession and acquire necessary skills.

A good number of donor agencies, international organisations and missions supported News Network to keep up the initiative. The programme is not only increasing the number of female journalists but also helping to achieve gender equality and women leadership in journalism profession. Since the beginning of the programme in 1998 and until 2015 the organization awarded fellowships to 285 young graduates. Many of them are now well set in the journalism profession.

At present women account for around only 6 percent of total journalists in Bangladesh. And, most of them are based in capital city Dhaka. So, the initiative has to go for a long way.

In the reporting period News Network with the support of CSR fund of Janata Bank awarded 15 young women a six-month fellowship on journalism. Janata Bank Limited is one of the largest state owned banks of the country. The programme completed successfully. By this time most of the fellows have joined in different print and electronic media houses as journalists.

5.2 PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT OF RURAL JOURNALISTS AND CSOs TO PROMOTE DEMOCRACY AND HUMAN RIGHTS

Violation of human rights issues has become a regular practice in the society. Poor, marginal and minority people are the worst victims of it. Most incidents happen in the country’s remote areas. Their voice, accesses to justice and humanitarian supports are limited. Besides, local right-based defenders do not have enough understanding on the issues and due to their lack of communication skills many incidents go unreported.

The programme has given focus on improving the professional ability of the most potential defenders, particularly to rural journalists, CSOs and NGO staffs to promote democracy and human rights issues effectively and courageously.

It's a two years long programme titled, 'Rural Media Development Programme for Promoting Democracy and Human Rights in Bangladesh', launched in December 2014.

Major activities of the project are; (i) training workshop for the journalists, working in remote districts, (ii) reporting competition for trained journalists on democracy and human rights issues, (iii)

networking with the gatekeepers of local media houses and (iv) media training for CSOs and NGO staffs. It will cover 12 remote districts of the country.

Until December 2015, 100 rural journalists and 60 CSOs and NGOs staffs have been trained. 40 local media gatekeepers including editors, publishers, executive editors and news editors participated in the networking meeting. Country's reputed journalists' trainers and experts conducted the trainings and events.

During the reporting period UNDEF supported programme were implemented in Brahmanbaria, Mymensingh, Rangpur, Dinajpur, Bogra and Khulna districts.

The project has drawn wider attention among the media people, officials and CSOs. They have found it quit relevant at present context of Bangladesh. Local administration, media houses and opinion leaders were very much supportive and cooperative to carry out the project activities. In most events government executives and officials attended. They appreciated the initiative and inspire the participants.

The participants, both journalists and CSOs/ NGO staffs found the programme highly effective to build their capacity. They have put forward several recommendations and requested to undertake follow-up programmes for them and expand the activities in other districts by the country.

Some results of the programmes are mentioned below;

- Journalists participated in the trainings to improve their understanding, knowledge, courage and confidence, and professional ability to deliver better reports on democracy and human rights. Their number of reports on the issues also increased then before.
- Trained journalists are much more careful about the accuracy of information and in following the ethical issues of journalism.

- Trained CSOs staffs improved their communication and reporting skill and sharing information with media people. Many of them also sharing information in their social media.
- Local media gatekeepers (editors and news policy makers), participated in the networking events received better understanding on the social impact of publishing more news stories with respect to human rights. They have expressed their commitment to defend and promote the issues for the greater interest through media actions

5.3 IMPROVING PROFESSIONAL ABILITY OF JOURNALISTS TO REPORT ON CLIMATE CHANGE ISSUES

The project focused on the journalists, working in Rajshahi, Cox's Bazar, Bagerhat & Khulna districts. It may mention that in last two decades millions people of those areas were badly affected by the climate change. Natural disasters, river erosion, drought and famine are the cause of miseries for thousands of people. This has displaced tens of thousands of people and many of them migrated to big cities for survival.

The programme activities were;

- To arrange 3, 4-day training workshop for journalists
- Organise 3, day-long interaction meetings with the editors



In December 2015, News Network participated in the first International Development Cooperation Meeting on Gender and Media (7-8 Dec) and the first The Global Alliance on Media and Gender (GAMAG) General Assembly (9-10 Dec) at Palais Des Nations, Geneva, Switzerland.

UNESCO, GAMAG, Republic of Lebanon and Hellenic Republic were the Co-Hosts and the partners were UN Women, United Nations Human Rights, FAO, WFP, WHO, UNHCR, UNEP, The World Bank, ITU, ILO, UNIDO, UNODC, WTO, WMO, UNCTED and Council of Europe. More than hundred of Government delegates, representatives of UN systems, donors and non-government organization, journalists and ICT sectors participated in the programmes, where Shahiduzzaman represented News Network, a leading media support organisation of Bangladesh.

The end goal of it is to achieve gender equality in media. GAMAG is an outcome of the UNESCO-led 2013 Global Forum on Media and Gender held in Bangkok, Thailand (2-4 December 2013). A Group of delegates are seen in the photo.


